OVERVIEW OF AVAILABLE SERVICES

Full-Service Birthparent Services – provides counseling to work through parenting or adoption services with ongoing post-placement counseling: Birthmother Support Group and Parent Support Group

Adoption Services – provides homestudies, adoption preparation and post-placement services for domestic adoptions as well as domestic adoption placement. Provides homestudies for step-parent, relative and International Adoptions.

Transracial/Transcultural Training – workshop that prepares and educates adoptive couples on issues associated with adopting a child of another race or nationality

Adoption Search Services – provides helpful and accurate information about the Indiana Adoption Registry to birthparents and adoptees as well as counseling and guidance when a birthparent or adoptee is interested in locating the other party

Donations Services – provides mothers and families with basic needs for their infants and children as well as support group mothers with basic household items and infant and children necessities.

WELCOME HOME!

"Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." Hebrews 4:16 NIV

As we enter this new season, we rejoice in all that spring represents: emerging hope and the anticipation of new beginnings. This season, the International Adoption team celebrated the successful completion of a Liberian adoption. This story is a testimony to God's greatness and His ability to make all things possible. Meet Makalya (Konah) and Makenzie (Youhn) and their mother, Mahnbuah. This is their faithful adoption story.

Mahnbuah was born in Liberia, Africa and after many years of unrest in her country, she decided to move to the United States when she was 24 years old. She established her life here, and in 2011, she went back to Liberia on a mission trip. As she made her way to the restroom, she noticed some children gathered around a tree. She approached the group of children, ages 11 to 6 years old, and she asked them their names.

Shamia joined St. Elizabeth | Coleman in November 2018 as our Search & Reunion Specialist. She brings personal and extensive professional adoption experience to this position, which makes her the perfect fit for our team. In her role, she assists adult adoptees and birth parents with searches, reunifications and provides counseling throughout the process.



Mahnbuah described that when one of the children looked up at her she saw the face of her uncle. Indeed, the children were her cousins. They were hungry and poorly cared for, but resilient 6-year-old twin girls. She could not believe these were her family members, and she was determined to support them in whatever way she could. Mahnbuah came home from her trip and began researching international adoption and how she might bring them home. She adopted the girls in Liberia in 2011 and monetarily supported them while they remained in their country. The next step was to complete the adoption process in the United States, so they could come home.

In September of 2012, I met with Mahnbuah for the first time. We had never completed a Liberian adoption at St. Elizabeth | Coleman, but I prayed a very specific prayer request that day. I prayed that if it was His will, it would be done to completion. I requested the assistance of Tim Winn, Director of Immigration Legal Services of Catholic Charities Indianapolis to assist us with the legal process. There were many unknowns, barriers and procedures that seemed too large to conquer in the days ahead of us. There were governmental delays and unexpected legal processes that needed to be accomplished. There was paperwork and more paperwork. There was a time in 2013 when the Liberian government closed adoption to the United States all together. There were many moments that felt like this would be a fruitless process. There were also many times that God needed to answer our challenges with specific resources, and He provided answers at each passage. Mahnbuah was also steadfast in her faith that God would see this to fruition. Through all of the hardships the decision continued to be... "press on."

In June of 2018 (almost 7 years after Mahnbuah met the girls under the tree), they arrived at their forever home. For Makalya and Makenzie, this will be a year of new beginnings and many "firsts". As we head into the spring season, let this story be a reminder that He makes all things new again... "Not to us, Lord, not to us but to your name be the glory, because of your love and faithfulness." Psalm 115:1 NIV.

PARENT SUPPORT GROUP SPARKS HOPE

Ruby first heard about the monthly Parent Support Group at St. Elizabeth | Coleman from a friend. At that time, Ruby was struggling financially and felt overwhelmed parenting her three young children. She was excited to join the Support Group. At each meeting, group members are presented with a parenting topic, such as child development stages, budgeting,

education and job search, goal setting and meal planning. At the end of each meeting, the women receive material assistance, which may include: diapers/wipes, children's clothing, toiletries, laundry soap and cleaning products. Ruby attended the Support Group for a year and a half. When she graduated from group, she felt more self-sufficient and independent. Ruby said she is



Because of her fantastic experience, she now enjoys telling other women in the community about our agency's support group.

She says, "It is important for women to know that they are not alone, someone cares."

Our services benefited 5,449 people both directly and indirectly.



Provided pregnancy and adoption counseling to 168 women

Helped **76 families** with adoption placements

Received 543 Adoption Search Inquiries of which 39 searches were completed

Educated **1,420 people** about adoption and available services

275 mothers and **431 children** received basic needs items through the Donation Program
